- 1. Consider a universe $U = \{1, 2, 3, \dots, 10\}$. Let $A = \{1, 4, 7, 10\}$, $B = \{1, 2, 3, 4, 5\}$, and $C = \{2, 4, 6, 8\}$. Which of the following is correct?
 - (a) $A \cup B = \{1, 4, 5, 7, 10\}$
 - (b) $B \cap C = \{2, 3, 4\}$

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

$$\neg (p \to q), \quad (p \to q) \land (q \to r), \quad (p \to q) \to r, \quad p \to (q \to r)$$

Long Problem: (20 pts) Use induction to show the following inequality:

$$\frac{1 \cdot 3 \cdot 5 \cdots (2n-1)}{2 \cdot 4 \cdot 6 \cdots (2n)} \le \frac{1}{\sqrt{n+1}} \quad \text{for } n = 1, 2, \cdots$$
